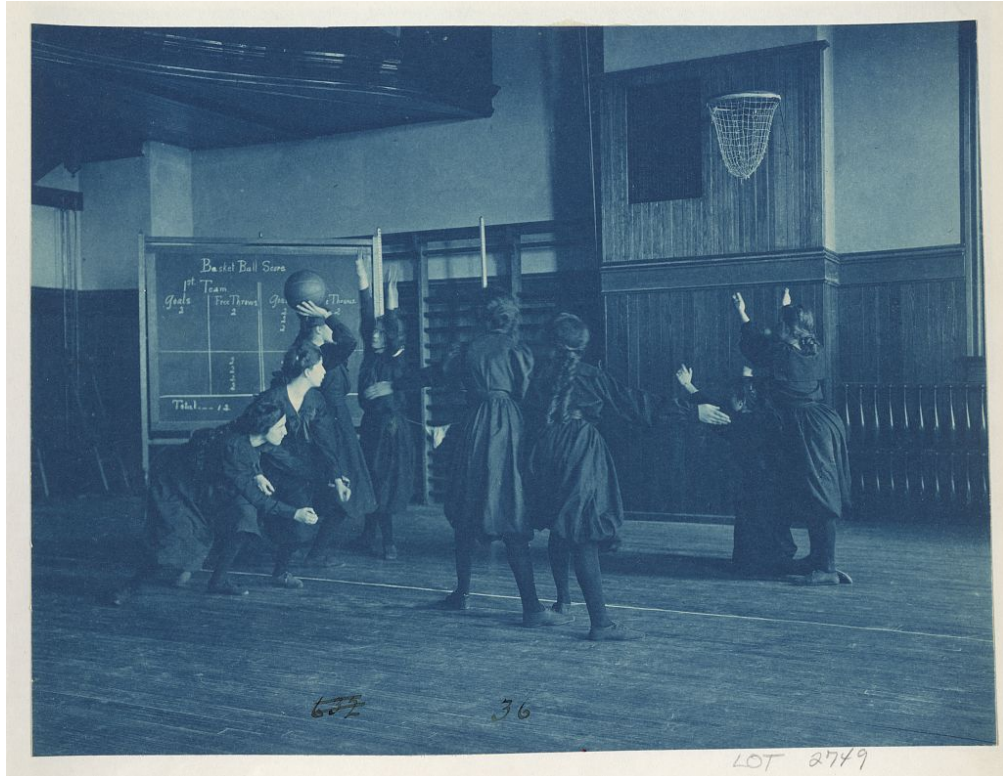

There will be a large audience to witness the game for the reason that about that time will find the largest number of callers, as the association has "open house" on New Year day.

Y. M. C. A. Notes.

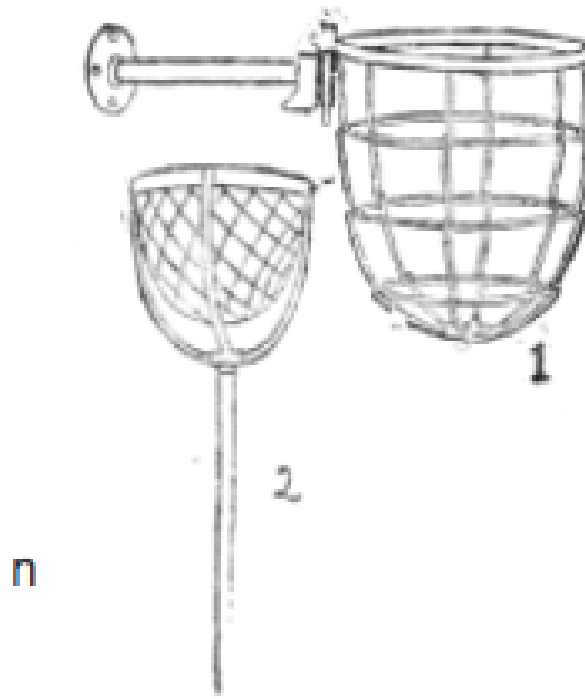
