




#### **Teaching Notes:**

Older students could search loc.gov for *capture the flag* to extend their learning to the symbolic importance of capturing flags from enemy troops. This particular example is a drawing made during the Civil War, and if I understand the description correctly, these rebel flags had been captured and then displayed in the "Old Hall of Representatives" in honor of George Washington's birthday.
