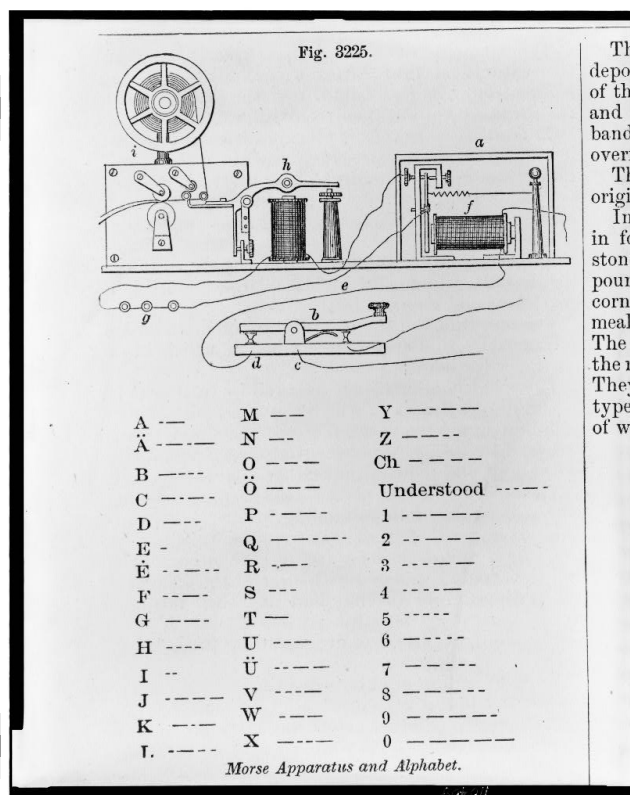

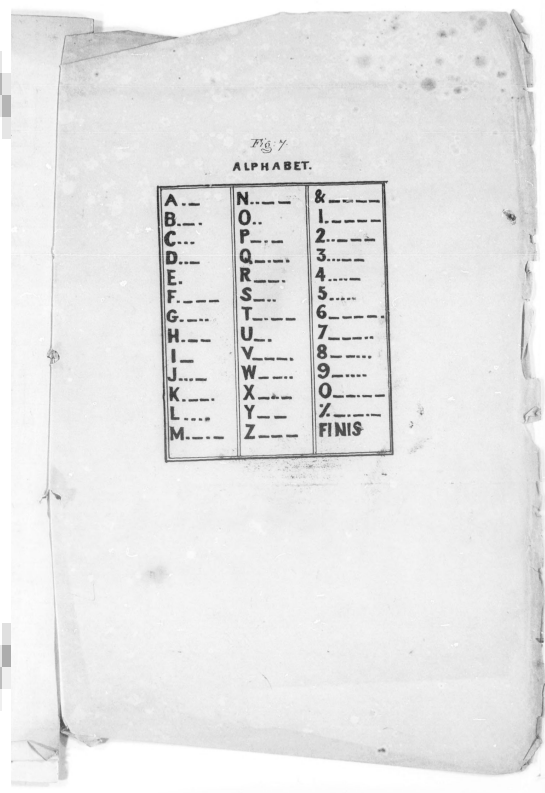

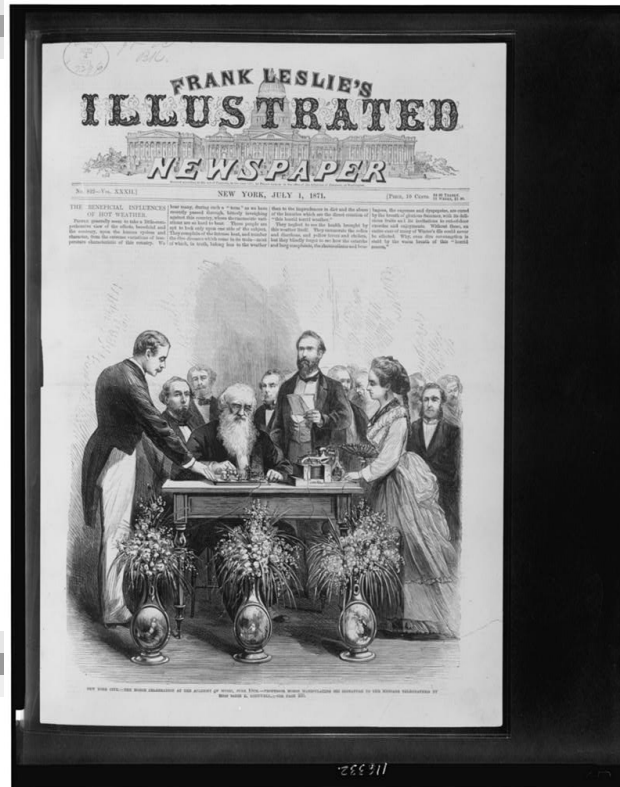

We purchased ours from American Science & Surplus supply for about \$7 each -- the key is \$4.75, but you need the light and 3 alligator clips with wire.

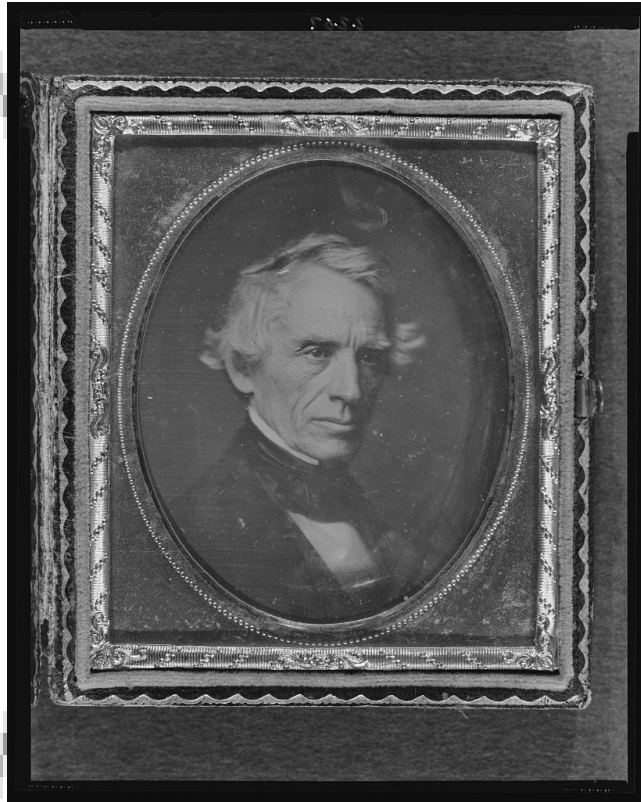

My father was a radio man with the Marine Corps during World War II on Iwo Jima, Guadalcanal, and Bougainville. Even when he was in his seventies, he could still tap out Morse code messages on the kitchen table to impress his grandchildren! Makes me wonder if there are any veterans left in our communities who could be invited in to talk with students about what it was like to do Morse code under fire.
