## **FAKE VIRUS CURES ECHO QUACK FLU ADS FROM CENTURY AGO**

### **Teaching Notes:**

"Ads promoting unproven miracle cures - including intravenous drips, ozone therapy and immunity-boosting music - have targeted people trying to avoid the coronavirus pandemic." As this *New York Times* article points out, "not much has changed" more than a century after the influenza pandemic of 1918. The difference is that the algorithms that serve up such ads today have little oversight and no common baseline for what is "true."

Five of the images from the article are credited to the Library of Congress. Using keywords from these ads, plus other keywords from the article, students could search Chronicling America for still more examples from 1918. The guiding question focus? "The scientific basis of cures." Or maybe, "Cures vs. Claims."

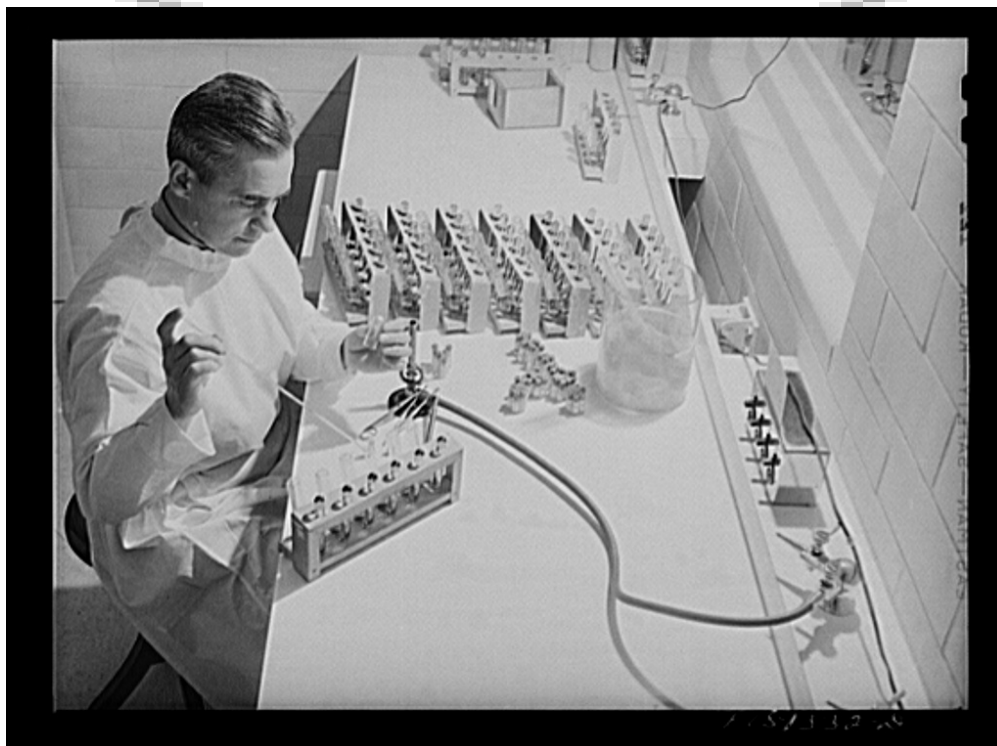
