Students then would replicate those sounds. They would also investigate how the sounds would be different in that same place today.

Much has reported about how different cities sounded during the stay-at-home orders with Covid-19 which got me thinking about this lesson. The photos don't have to relate to city sound - any place will do. The images I've added already are collected from various albums in our TPS Teacher Network.


Have you seen other images from the Library of Congress that you think might work for this lesson idea? If so, please add them to the album. When I build out this idea I'll share it here.




